

29A, AB2, Troy - Rebellion Papers

Description:

1) The final confession of Thomas Neil who is being executed for his involvement in the murder of Patrick Murphy.

Undated

2) A proclamation addressed by the Lord Major of Dublin, John Rambert, to comply with the regulations regarding on matters such as ammunition and arms

Dated 24th May 1798

3) An extract of a letter from Rev James Mc Ghee of Cavan, reporting on the events of the rebels that previous day

Dated 26th May 1798

4) An extract of a letter from captain Scobie to lieutenant General Lake in which he reports 'three hundred and fifty (Rebels) were found dead'.

Dated 27th May 1798

5) An extract of a letter from lieutenant Colonel Long field of the Royal Cork Militia, sent to the Lieutenant General Craig reporting the rebels position at the upper 'end of the town'

Dated 29th May 1798

6) A statement reporting on the violence and the series numbers of attacks that took place by the army at Vinegar Hill.

Dated 2 June 1798

7) An extract of a letter from General Johnston to Lieutenant General Lake. In this extract he reports on the significant numbers of those that were wounded, killed and missing since the attack of the previous day

Dated 9th June 1798

8) An account given by Lieutenant General Lake from major General Needham stating that the rebels attacked his position in Arklow

Dated 10th June 1798

9) A report written on the attack of Colonel Stapleton near saint field and the death of Captain Knox and many others.

Dated 12th June 1798

10) A report written from General Nugent, explaining the events of the rebels advances.

Dated 14th June 1798

11) Report on the rebels surrendering their arms and ammunition. The major general Nugent will accept this only if they promise to give up their Leader Munroe and the 'other Principal traitors'.

Dated 16th June 1798

12) A report concerning General Barnett and the involvement of the rebels attack on Kilboggan

Dated 19th June 1798

13) A letter from Lieutenant General Lake to Lord Viscount of Castlereagh to report on the attack of the rebel at Vinegar Hill.

Dated 21st June 1798

14) A letter written from lieutenant General Lake which includes a reply from previous letter from Lord Castlereagh

Dated 22-23rd of June 1798

15) Extract of a letter received from Major General Sir Charles Asgill and his fears of 'the consequences that might result from Allowing the Rebels who fled'

16) A report on the rebels attack on Hackettstown

Dated 28th June 1798

17) A report on the rebels retreat from the Wicklow Gap

Dated 6th July 1798

18) A report describing the Rebels attack on the town of Clonard in which fifty people died.
